Devotional Meditation Elder, Monica Stevens April 13, 2022

It's Just Me? John 3:16-17

"For God so loved the world that he gave his only Son, so that everyone who believes in him may not perish but have eternal life. Indeed, God did not send the Son into the world to condemn the world, but in order that the world might be saved through him."

I attended a meeting by Zoom last night. Since we had a guest in attendance who is not a regular member of the committee, we each took a moment to introduce ourselves by giving our name and our church affiliation. As we went around, the introductions were pretty standard until one person said, "I'm _____ and I'm just _____. This person was of no lesser value to the committee or to their own home church than anyone else in the group, but that word "just" seemed to indicate that the speaker somehow felt they were less than others.

I was struck by that person's perception of their role within the church or at least the committee and I obviously continued to think about it well after the meeting. I realized that I and most other people do this sort of thing on a regular basis, often without even realizing it. Sometimes that "just" is justified. I had a congregation ask if I could moderate a Session meeting for them and I had to decline because I was neither ordained nor commissioned to their church. As far as moderating meetings was concerned, I was just a regular person with no special authority. More often though, we use "just" as a weasel word that we hide behind because we have low confidence in ourselves, we feel that modesty and humility demand it, or that we feel we are unworthy of recognition.

There are plenty of people and circumstances in the world that are willing to "take us down a peg" if we get too sure of ourselves, but the church shouldn't be one of them. Our Scriptures and our faith teach us that people—all people—are so precious and important to God that he came in the person of Jesus to live among us and to die for us that we all might be reconciled to God now and eternally. We each have intrinsic value because that is how God made us and that is how God sees us. God knows each of us--knows our best attributes and knows where we fall short—and yet, God

still loves us and calls us to himself. This all-encompassing love is not something we can ever merit or earn. It is ours through God's grace alone. Isn't that the whole message of the Gospel?

As you meditate on the events of this week—Jesus' triumphal entry, the cleansing of the temple, teaching daily in the temple, the Last Supper, washing the disciples' feet, Jesus' betrayal, trial, crucifixion, death, burial, and Resurrection—remember that it was all done for you and all of humankind. The only thing Jesus asks of us is that we love God and we love our neighbor. This is how the law of God is fulfilled.

I would like to change the way we use the word "just." No longer should we think of ourselves as "just me" as if there was some deficiency in being who you are (all of us have room for improvement, but we are all worthy of God's love). Instead, I would like each of us to live knowing that God loves me just as I am. If we can accept the love and sense of worth that God has for us, we will continue to grow and develop into our full potential as God's beloved children now, and for eternity. Let these hymn verses be our prayer:

Just as I am, Thou wilt receive, wilt welcome, pardon, cleanse, relieve; Because Thy promise I believe, O Lamb of God, I come, I come.

Just as I am, Thy love unknown has broken every barrier down, Now to be Thine, yea, Thine alone, O Lamb of God, I come, I come. Amen.
