"My dear brothers and sisters, how can you claim that you have faith in our glorious Lord Jesus Christ if you favor some people more than others?" James 2:1

I heard one of those pastor's jokes a while back that rang a little too much real life instead of in jest. It goes like this; a man once asked a minister to perform a memorial service for his pet dog in the church. The minister insisted that, "This church does not hold memorial services for dead dogs!" As he turned to leave, the man said, "I really loved that dog. I was going to offer a million-dollar honorarium for performing the service." Then the minister immediately spoke up, "Wait a minute, you never told me your dog was a Christian!"

Whether you relate to the minister who was about to miss out on a lucrative financial opportunity or the man that thinks his offer should buy him a stronger vote of persuasion, we all do it to some extent. Whatever the defining factors are: race, gender, economic class, political views, or special interests, too often we categorize people as "in" or "out. Acting like this says we play favorites. I know I have been guilty of avoiding contact with people who desperately need a friend, rather I seek out someone who thinks or acts more like me. Too often I, and maybe you too, determine who we want to befriend based upon how useful they may be to us.

Maybe all we may need is a good reminder of how wrong playing favorites can be. We

can't make everyone our "bestie" and Jesus recognizes that in us as human nature. Yet we are still called to strive towards doing better. Jesus calls us to love our neighbor as we love ourselves avoiding those personal biases, when possible, and freely love others.

Jesus said, in John 13, that the world will judge whether we are truly His followers by whether or not we display genuine love for one another. So how do we do that? By moving past our comfort zones and extend grace, love, and friendship to others, long past our differences. Extend a hand to another and wait to see who will accept your offer today.
