## From the Bridge Pastor

### *The Good News of God-with-us*

On the radio I hear the classic song ring out again, “it’s the most wonderful time of the year!” I frown a little that I have heard that song since the day after Halloween. As the commercial side of the season has crept earlier and earlier, it seems that the time leading up to Christmas is rather “the busiest time of the year!” Our family schedules, social schedules, and even church schedules are packed with events and trips and shopping.

Earlier in November, when Clint and I attended a week of continuing education at Union Seminary in Richmond, we had a conversation with other clergy colleagues about the “what, how and why” of ministry in churches today. Oftentimes, churches spend a lot of time and energy on the “what,” planning programs, having meetings, calculating budgets, counting attendance figures. But if churches get caught up in a focus on those things, sometimes the “why” can get lost. Our “why” is the heart of who we are, our purpose and mission as God’s people.

I connected this insight to the Advent and Christmas season. For me, the deep “why” of Christmas is expressed in John’s Gospel, “the Word became flesh and lived with us,” and in Matthew’s Gospel, “He shall be called Emmanuel, God with us.” I’ve seen some poetic and thoughtful writers express it this way “Christmas is not about presents, but God’s presence.”

I’ll admit right up front, I get as busy as the next person during the Christmas season. My prayer and hope for myself and for all of us is that we can focus less on the “what” (decorations, events, presents) and more on the “why” of Christmas. The way I think to do this is to take a lesson from God in Jesus—as Jesus was God-with-us, let’s be with-each-other in this season. Call up a friend or church member you haven’t seen in a while, come to worship with the church family each Sunday, make a point of giving your presence as the best gift this season!

Your Worship Committee has been busy planning for the Season of Advent and Christmas.

Sunday, December 1, is the first Sunday of Advent. The Hanging of the Greens will be a part of both worship services that morning. This tradition, begun last year at First Presbyterian Martinsville, involves the bringing of the symbols of our faith that prepare us for Christmas and the coming of Christ into our lives. These symbols, the wreaths, the Chrismon Tree and Chrismons, the Advent Wreath and candles, will be placed in the sanctuary during the service. Members will be given Chrismon ornaments to hang on the Tree at the appropriate time.

Once again members of our church will light the candles on the Advent Wreath each Sunday during Advent at both services and on Christmas Eve.

**The times for the Christmas Eve services have been changed this year.** There will be a worship service at **6:00 p.m.** and another at **9:00 p.m.** Both services will include a brief message as well as an opportunity to bring an offering of mittens, hats, scarves, warm socks or a monetary offering. These will be given to the Salvation Army for distribution to those who can most benefit from them. There will be a celebration of **the Lord’s Supper** at the 9:00 service.

On Sunday afternoon, December 15, at 3pm, the Chancel Choir and Sanctuary Ringers along with Virginia King, violinist and Lynn Pritchett, flautist, will present their **annual Christmas music program** in the Sanctuary. ***Jennifer's Adventures in North Africa***

Jennifer Stanley, daughter of Patsy Stanley and a second-year medical student in Charleston, SC, will be speaking about her participation in a medical mission program in North Africa last summer. She will be sharing information about her experience with this program Sunday, December 22, at 9:40 a.m. in the Reed Classroom.

As a medical student, she worked alongside the physicians on her team where she interviewed and performed basic physical exams. In two weeks her team saw, treated, and prayed for almost 1200 patients.

She reported that, while the team was selective in overtly sharing the Gospel and their faith with patients for security reasons, by being Americans it was assumed that they were Christians, which was used to the team's advantage. They were able to share Christ's love with the patients simply by treating them with love and respect which sharply contrasted with the way they were treated by most North African doctors.
