Devotional Meditation Elder, Dr. Denny Casey January 10, 2022

What good is it, my brothers and sisters, if you say you have faith but do not have works? James 2:14 (NRSV)

This verse is a constant reminder to me to put my faith into action. As James proclaims, faith without works is dead as a body without the Holy Spirit.

As Christians, it's crucial to emphasize though, no number of good deeds can lead to salvation. We can't earn our way into God's favor.

I'm reminded of the 1998 film Saving Private Ryan based on the WWII story of a family named Ryan. There were four sons in the Ryan family. The father is dead, and all four boys go off to fight in the war, leaving their mother at home. Tragically, three of the four sons were killed in action. The War Department enlists the help of Captain John Miller to find the surviving son, James, and bring him home, to ensure the grieving mother has at least one son returning home.

Captain Miller selects a small squad of soldiers to go in search of Private Ryan, travelling from one unit to the next and fighting German soldiers as they go across the French countryside. Miller and his squad feel resentment towards Ryan, and as they inevitably start to get killed off, the survivors can't help but wonder does Ryan deserve to be saved? When they finally come across Ryan, he insists on remaining with his company and does not want to be saved. How then should Miller proceed? They stay with him and fight. They become engaged in a fierce battle with many casualties including most of the squad. Captain Miller lies mortally wounded but manages to whisper into Ryan's young ears, "earn this."

Ultimately, *Saving Private Ryan* is less about those who suffered and more about those who have been spared suffering. In the end, is not the courage of the soldiers who fought at Normandy; it's the debt owed them by their children and their children's children. Mrs. Ryan's son was not the only child those brave men saved.

From a Christian perspective, no one deserves to be saved and we can't earn salvation by the good deeds we do. But as Christians, we have a chance on this earth to do something exceptional for God. Former President Jimmy Carter said, "my faith demands that I do whatever I can, wherever I can, whenever I can, for as long as I can with whatever I have to try to make a difference." Jesus died so that believers could be saved, but also so that we could find what God wants us to do and do what we can to make a difference and above all to honor God.

Prayer

Heavenly Father, thank You for sending Your Son who died for our sins and for teaching us that the path to salvation is through trust and faith in You and not from the good works we do. But we pray that as we walk in Your grace that Christ may be seen in us and that we may bring forth the fruit of good works in the world - to Your praise and glory. In Jesus' name we pray, amen.


