Meditation for September 9, 2020

Based on Psalm 147

Sometime last week I came across a cartoon that spoke to me. In the picture, a seated woman wearing a long dress and a wide-brimmed hat was posing for a painting. The artist, however, was a giraffe and due to his unique overhead vantage point, his portrait showed only two concentric circles—the circular crown of the hat surrounded by the circle of the brim of the hat. The gist of the cartoon was that perspective defines our view of reality.

I was reminded of this thought as I meditated on Psalm 147 this week. The psalm was most likely written during the period when Israel returned to Jerusalem from the Babylonian exile. When the exiles returned, the Jerusalem they had known and loved was a pale shadow of what it had once been. The buildings, especially the Temple, were in ruins and the once fruitful fields around the city were an unkempt wasteland. It would have been easy and understandable for the psalmist to throw up his hands in despair, but instead of dwelling on the desolation and ugliness of what he saw around him, he altered his perspective and turned his gaze toward God.

Life is not easy for any of us right now. A viral pandemic restricts our movements and endangers our health, our lives, and our livelihoods. There is disagreement, anger, and violence in our land. There are natural disasters and problems on the world stage that negatively impact millions. Like the psalmist, it would be easy and understandable for us to throw up our hands and give in to despair and ugliness. However, if like the psalmist we change our perspective and direct our gaze toward God, we not only find hope, strength, and sustenance for life, we also discover joy in the midst of our pain. I invite you to read and meditate on Psalm 147 in the manner of the verses I have selected and amplified below so that as the psalmist speaks to Israel, you can hear God's word and comfort and hope for you across the millennia.

¹"Praise the Lord! How good it is to sing praises to our God: for he is gracious, and a song of praise is fitting." (Our God is good, and singing God's praises adjusts our perspective.)

²"The Lord builds up Jerusalem; he gathers the outcast of Israel." (God gathers us up and holds us fast as a loving parent would.)

³"He heals the brokenhearted, and binds up their wounds." (God knows our wounds and brokenness, and God works to heal us.)

⁵"Great is our Lord and abundant in power; his understanding is beyond measure." (God's power and knowledge are beyond our comprehension, but God always cares for God's creation.)

¹¹"But the Lord takes pleasure in those who fear him, in those who hope in his steadfast love." (God doesn't delight in our strength or power. God delights in hearts that honor him because they trust in God's unending love.)

When we focus on the goodness and steadfast love of God poured out on all of creation and on each of us individually, we are better able to find our voices and proclaim with the psalmist, "Hallelujah! Praise the Lord!"

May we find our joy as we praise our gracious, loving God. Amen.

CONGREGATIONAL MEETING

On Sunday, September 20 at 11:00 a.m. a virtual congregational meeting will be held on Zoom to present the names of the nominees for the class of 2023.

Our first in-person worship is planned for October 4 at 10:00 a.m. We will not, however, offer Sunday school or youth programs. The nursery will not be open. All children must remain in the sanctuary with their families. Communion will be celebrated. Individual wafer and juice sets will be provided for each person and will be located in the pews.

Opening Soon But We Need YOU! We have set a tentative re-gathering date of Sunday, October 4, in person2020 but we still need volunteers! As we prepare to reopen parts of the building, we are still in need of your help. If you are healthy and are not at-risk, please consider volunteering. Below you will see brief descriptions of some of the main responsibilities:

- **1. Building Team** will prepare the building by posting signs, closing off open spaces and rooms; taping off some areas of the building; the sanctuary and restrooms will be marked for physical distancing
- **2. Cleaning Team -** clean and disinfect before and after services; work with staff to make sure all the commonly touched surfaces and furnishings are cleaned regularly
- **3. Screeners** screen congregants as they enter the narthex; check temperature by using a digital thermometer; communicate health guidelines and best practices; facilitate use of hand sanitizer dispenser; provide masks and gloves as need
- **4. Ushers** welcome congregants and work with screeners on Sunday morning to assist with safe distancing and seating; prepare collection plates, count offerings, deposit collection; take names of everyone in the service

More detailed descriptions will be provided with a checklist for each area. Please let Rita (632-3431, ritaofficefpc@gmail.com) know which teams(s) you are willing to serve by Sunday, September 20. We will then schedule training sessions for each team using Zoom or telephone.


