Pentecost, an ancient Jewish festival, is celebrated as the "Birthday of the Church." On the first Pentecost after Jesus' resurrection and ascension, the Holy Spirit descended on the disciples with a loud rushing wind and tongues of fire above each of them (Acts 2). They burst out of hiding and began to preach the Good News throughout the known world. Immediately after the worship service Sunday, there will be a **reception** featuring red birthday cake in the Fellowship Hall. The liturgical color for Pentecost is red, and we encourage everyone to **wear red this Sunday**.

Our congregation will receive the **Pentecost Offering** again this Sunday. Your gifts help the church encourage, develop, and support its young people and address the needs of at-risk children. Our congregation will keep 40% of the Pentecost offering for youth programs. 
the Stars of Night" by Clausen commissioned in honor of the late music director O. Randolph Minter.
