
Pastor's Corner

You're a riot, I love you!

But if you are willing to listen, I say, love your enemies, Do good to those who hate you. Pray for those who curse you. Pray for those who hurt you. If someone slaps you on one cheek, turn the other cheek. If someone demands your coat, offer your shirt also. Give what you have to anyone who asks for it. And when things are taken away from you, don't try to get back. Do for others as you would like them to do for you....You must be compassionate, just as your Father is compassionate! Luke 6:27-31, 36

Los Angeles, California: swimming pools, movie stars—this is a city known for its glitz and glamour! But it's also known for other things like gang wars, racial tensions, and riots. How did a city known throughout the world as the place where so many famous celebrities choose to live their lives turn out to be a breeding ground for so much violence? Many of you probably remember the Rodney King police brutality trial and O. J. Simpson on trial for the murders of his wife and a friend. Riots broke out related to these events, but who threw the first rock or fire bomb is unclear. One thing is clear, however, when the first bottle was thrown, came another, then another, and another. When one car was turned over, others were to follow. And when one window was smashed, came another, and another—you get the picture!

Riots have the ability to sway groups of people and cause them to do things they wouldn't normally do simply because it's easy to get caught up in the crowd. Perhaps we should consider starting a different type of riot, the type that Jesus started. Jesus started a "riot of reckless love." We are still affected today by how Jesus spoke to the woman at the well or the way he ate in the home of a tax collector. Or what about the way Jesus stepped in and prevented an adulterous woman from being stoned? Jesus loved people whom society may have portrayed as unloveable, maybe the same way we portray ourselves as unlovable before God sometimes. Today, over 2000 years later, we are still swayed by how Jesus loved people.



So now Jesus is calling each of us to start our day being caught up in a kind of "holy riot" by practicing simple acts of love and kindness to those around us.

Who knows where or with whom it will start, but one act of love can lead to another, and another, and another—well, you get the picture!
