From My Perspective Within The Kingdom

This morning (Wednesday, December 8, 2010) I left the house at 5:50 a.m. to walk my dog, Toby, and the outside temperature was 15 degrees; I'm not sure what the temperature was with the wind chill added to the equation. At any rate, it was (Brrrrrr) cold! It was so cold, in fact, that I was wearing gloves.

When I do wear gloves I almost always think of Carol Howie's story that took place late one winter's night in a New York subway. It was a cold, blustery, and bitter night, and very few people were on the subway at that hour. At one station, a dismal-looking woman got on. Her clothes were ragged and dirty. She was either extremely tired or weak from illness, or hungry – or perhaps she had had too much to drink.

As the train lurched forward, she stumbled, slumped into a seat, and went fast asleep. She slept through the screeching and the swaying of the train. Her hands were nestled inside two of the most tattered gloves you've ever seen – so full of holes that you could see that her hands were cold and chapped and almost frostbitten.

Then a strange thing happened. A young Puerto Rican boy stood up to get off of the train as it slowed to stop. He could have gone out the exit closest to him, but he chose to go past that sleeping woman. He paused in front of her for a few moments; then he removed his gloves, laid them in her lap, and got off the train. When someone asked him why he had given her his gloves, his answer was simple but profound. He said, "Because I am a Christian!" He did it because of Christ; he dedicated his act of kindness to Christ.

As we prepare to step out of 2010 and into a brand, new year, I propose that we make and strive to follow only one New Year's resolution, which is summed up best by the young, Puerto Rican boy's reply: "Because I am a Christian!" I suggest that we let that principle be our guiding light for the next twelve months. If we lose weight or keep in better touch with our friends or read three good books a month, that's all well and good. But our main goal in life and certainly in the new year ahead should be that we are going to be Christians – "little Christs" – to the very best of our abilities and energies.

I like that notion of dedicating our lives in acts of kindness to Christ and, along the way, other people are blessed by the good will we create. The Lord knows that there is way too much ugliness, cynicism, and darkness that takes place in the world. Just read the newspapers – especially the letters to the editor – and you will get your fill of the daily nastiness that some folks like to dish out in big heaping servings. On the other hand, we can, we must, live to make a difference – why? – "because I am a Christian!"

We express our love for God as we love, care for, and serve others. When we reach out to another human being and help that person, it is as though Christ himself is reaching out to them with love and compassion through us, and the love of God becomes incarnate once again. The Apostle Paul said it well, "Above all, clothe yourselves with love, which binds everything together in perfect harmony" (Colossians 3:14).
