From My Perspective Within The Kingdom

The other day I was sitting in a Facilities Committee and we were discussing the various items on the agenda. Whenever we meet together, we are always aware of the rich legacy we have inherited from those who have gone before us. We are truly blessed with a beautiful church plant and, in turn, we use our facilities to be a blessing to both our members and to the community. As we talked, we shared some of the ways our entire church facility, which was built in three stages, is used.

Of course, the facilities are used for Sunday School and worship; for over two years now, we have had an additional worship service most Sundays, beginning at 8:35 a.m. The Session has monthly meetings, as do most of the seven committees of the Session. The Presbyterian Women and some of their circles meet in the church. The church's music program (hand bells, choirs, and other musical activities) for children, youth, and adults meet often each week. Although the church is quiet during these summer months, it's a beehive of activity during the school year with the Weekday School children and the Early Learning Intervention (ELI) children and their teachers 3-4 mornings a week. The Tuesday Morning Bible Study class also meets each week during the school year. Scout Troop 61 has weekly meetings here and we provide a room for the Boy Scout District office, and there are district meetings, which occasionally take place here; also, from time to time, a Cub Scout den has met here. We host a Narcotics Anonymous group, which meets here on Thursday and Saturday evenings. The Piedmont Youth Soccer League board meets here. We are an approved and trained emergency feeding center for the Red Cross if a natural disaster should ever strike our community. We are hosting the Vacation Bible School for five churches in July; and, MHC 3 will use our facilities throughout the month of July as well. There are weddings, wedding rehearsal dinners, and receptions and there are services giving Witness to the Resurrection (and more receptions), which take place in the church. Other fellowship activities include Lemonade on the Lawn, Kirk Night suppers, and luncheons after church. From time to time, various small groups from the Presbytery of the Peaks meet at our church, and we usually host the presbytery for an all day meeting every five years.

I imagine that I have overlooked some other groups in this detailed listing of activities. When you look at the many and varied ways that our facilities are put to use (really good use!), it probably won't surprise you to learn that, on average, our monthly city utilities bill (for electric, water, and sewage) is \$2,168. That's a lot of money but, then again, we get a lot and do a lot for our money. You can also see why we strive to be good stewards of our facilities and make sure that lights, as well as heating and cooling units, are turned off when they are not in use.

I am grateful for our beautiful and well-used facilities. We are truly blessed, and we try our very best to be a blessing – to God and to others – with all that we are and with all that we have. I am also reminded that what really makes this place a church is the communion of the saints, who gather here for study, worship, fellowship, and service offered to the glory of God the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit. Thanks be to God!


Session Highlights for May 25, 2010

Music Together is going strong this summer. This is the class for children ages birth through 4 and a care giver-Mom, Dad, Grandma, etcetera. Music for Fall

We will have the same schedule as last year unless there is a need to change. The schedule is as follows:

WAM Mondays from 2:45 to 4:30 for ages 1st grade through 6th. WAM stands for *Worship, Arts and Music*. We have a wonderful group that sings, dances, prepares for worship, has fun arts and crafts projects and handbells. This year we will have two large-scale plays, one at Christmas and one during Lent.

\$35 per quarter that they cost. I have 4th and 5th graders still ask to sing some of their favorite songs from so long ago.

Cantabile Bells is our group for Middle and High School bell ringers. We usually meet after church on various Sundays depending on schedules. It is an awesome group!!
