Pastor's Corner

See what love the Father has given us, that we should be called children of God; and that is what we are. 1 John 3:1a

Whenever a baby is born, it seems obligatory for doting relatives to try to decide which side of the family the baby favors. We hear things like, "She has her mother's eyes, but her father's chin." Of course, when the child is very young, familial resemblance is solely in the eye of the beholder, and so, there is very rarely a consensus of opinion.

As children grow and mature into young adults, family traits are much easier to identify. One of my two brothers and I both have my father's blue eyes and my other brother shared my mother's brown eyes. The brown-eyed brother and I shared my father's brown hair, while my blue-eyed brother got my mother's black hair. All three of us shared similar enough facial features that it was readily apparent that we were related even though we are each very different in other ways. However, it wasn't our resemblance that made us a functioning family; it was our relationship with one another. The same is true of God's family.

Jesus addressed God as Abba, Father, and he taught his followers to do the same. Through Jesus, we have been grafted into God's family. This is God's gift to us born out of God's eternal and faithful love. We are called and invited to live in loving relationship with God. The Almighty God who is the author of all creation and who reigns in power and majesty desires to live in relationship with us as our Father, who loves us, provides for us, guides and directs us, protects us, and nurtures us. There is nothing we can do to earn this status;

we can only receive it as grace.

Of course, we are the other half of this familial relationship. As we grow and mature in our relationship with God, we begin to take on qualities, characteristics, and attributes that sharpen our family resemblance to God. God is loving, so we become more loving. God cares for our needs, so we become more nurturing, caring, and protective. God is forgiving, so we become more forgiving. God gives freely of Godself, so we learn to give of ourselves to others without looking for something in return. These changes don't happen all at once, and they don't happen in the same way with every person, but the more time we spend serving God by serving for others, the more we begin to resemble our heavenly Father.

I give you a new commandment: Love each other. Just as I have loved you, so you must love each other. This is how everyone will know that you are my disciples, when you love each other. John 13:34-35 (CEB)

Seeing the love God has for each and all of us, may we learn to love ourselves and one another as God has loved us.
