Devotional Meditation Elder, Monica Stevens August 10, 2022

A Cloud of Witnesses Hebrews 12:1-2

"Therefore, since we are surrounded by so great a cloud of witnesses, let us also lay aside every weight and sin that clings so closely, and let us run with perseverance the race that is set before us, looking to Jesus the pioneer and perfecter of our faith, who for the sake of the joy that was set before him endured the cross, disregarding its shame, and has taken his seat at the right hand of the throne of God."

Reading today's scripture reminded me of the time when our son, Daniel, ran a marathon in Richmond. We excitedly saw him off at the starting line, and then rushed off to get the next site where we could wait for him and then cheer him on as he ran by. We did that a number of times until we got to the finish line. Dan seemed to enjoy having people cheer him on, and I know as tired as he was at the finish line, our presence helped give him a little extra motivation to keep going.

Chapter 11 of Hebrews begins with the statement, "Now faith is the assurance of things hoped for, the conviction of things not seen." The author then continues by providing a veritable Who's Who of people who demonstrated their faith through their actions. Some of these people like Abel, Enoch, Noah, Abraham and Sarah, Isaac, Jacob, and Moses are well known to us. Others such as Rahab, Gideon, and Barak may not be as well known. Then finally, there are those who are not mentioned by name but only by their deeds. All of these people are our ancestors in God's family and through their faith. These, as well as the many other people recorded in the Old Testament lived, built, and passed down our faith heritage to us, but their faith stories only received completion through Jesus Christ, the pioneer and perfecter of our faith. We now not only have the faith stories of people who survived furnaces, lion's dens, and being thrown in a cistern, but we have the promise of faith fulfilled in the life, death, and resurrection of our Lord, Jesus. Through Jesus, we know that nothing, not even death, can separate us from the love of God.

As we run the race that is our life of faith, look to the sidelines and see the familiar faces of all those mentioned in Hebrews 11. They are all there scattered along our journeys to cheer us on and keep us faithful. Not only are the notables from the Bible present to encourage us, but all those from our particular lives and backgrounds who have helped to form and strengthen us as we grew in faith. They are always there to urge us forward and cheer and sustain us.

Whether or not we have thought about it, we all have that "great cloud of witnesses" surrounding us, helping us to grow in our faith. I hope you will take some time to think about the people from the Bible, from history, and from your personal background who have nurtured your faith and provided you with examples to follow in your own life. Then think about all of those people now living who, by their example, encourage and direct you. God does not intend for us to live alone, but provides us with this faith community that is rooted in God's presence through Jesus Christ.

Take a few minutes to draw a cloud and enter the names of all those who have had an influence on your faith story. Then draw another cloud and enter the names of all those whom you have influenced in one way or another by the example of your faith. Our faith grows in an ever expanding cloud of being influenced by others, and in turn, sharing that faith with others.

Dear God, we thank you for the gift of faith that strengthens and nurtures us while doing the same for others. Thank you for those who have and who are cheering us as we run the race set before us. In Jesus' name we pray. Amen.
