**Devotional Meditation Elder Monica Stevens December 30, 2021** 

#### **Looking Back, Moving Forward**

Matthew 25:31-46

The end of one year and the beginning of a new year is the perfect time for retrospection, introspection, and prospection (looking forward; foresight). We look back over the old year and remember actions, events, and relationships that brought us and others joy, peace, love, safety, and fulfillment. We also remember those things that were less positive—actions, events, and relationships that caused pain, hardship, distrust, enmity, and damage to us or others. We search ourselves to find ways to recreate the good and remedy the not so good. We look forward to living in such a way that we will engender more good than harm. Many of us make resolutions at this time of year that center around our personal lives—to exercise more, eat better, lose weight, spend more time with family, et cetera. There is nothing wrong with any of that, but we also need to look at our spiritual lives as individuals and as a church family. Since we are a Mathew 25 Congregation, it makes sense to use Matthew 25:31-46 as our guide. We need to ask ourselves individually and collectively, "When Lord, did we see you hungry, thirsty, a stranger, ill-clothed, sick, or in prison and what did we do about it?" We are already doing things to reach out to others such as sponsoring our Weekday School, holding monthly Community Breakfasts, contributing to the Warming Center through our virtual poinsettias, participating in the Blood Drives, and other activities, but we cannot rest on our laurels because the needs of the world and the community continue to evolve and change. To help us stay attuned to the need around us, I suggest that we each commit to engage in a period of daily prayer that uses the Seven-Day Prayer Card based on the Seven Marks of a Vital Congregation for the next year. This Prayer Card is a template for prayer that asks you to pray and meditate on a different facet of a life lived in Christ each day, while still providing you with the opportunity to add your own joys or concerns. The first part of the prayer offers praise and thanksgiving and the second part of the prayer lifts up petitions and concerns. Prayer is an important part of lifelong discipleship, and praying together like this will strengthen our community and help define our sense of purpose for life together in Christ. May God bless us as we move forward together in prayer.

Living God, we give you thanks and praise for the new things you are doing among us...

Sunday - for the transforming presence of Christ

Monday—for your call to follow the way of Jesus

Tuesday—for the gift of your Word made flesh

Wednesday—for the good news of your holy realm

Thursday—for Jesus' example of humble service

Friday—your great love for all the world

Saturday—or common ministry in Jesus name

Add your own joys and thanksgivings to your prayer.

**The church office will open for limited appointments.** Please call to schedule. Please enter at the narthex for Sunday worship and during the week use the back door at the portico.


