Dear First Presbyterian family,

You are invited to gather in our parking lot on Sunday at 9:30am as palms become ashes. During a brief ceremony last year's hosannah saturated palm branches will become our Ash Wednesday ashes.

A smudge of ash on our forehead is a visible sign of humility and repentance. Ashe is part of the cycle of life. Like when a tree is destroyed in a fire, all that is left is ash. Ashes are left whenever something living, something holy, something vibrant is destroyed.

Biblically, ashes are a sign of repentance and mourning. Job sat in ash and sackcloth. In the book of Ester, Mordecai donned sackcloth and ashes after learning of the imminent doom of the Jewish people at the hands of Haman. And even the king of Nineveh, a Gentile whose nation was hostile toward God's people, covered himself with ashes of repentance after Jonah warned him that Nineveh would be destroyed if the people did not amend their ways. There are many examples of ash as a visible sign of our humility and repentance before God.

We will have a brief litany and discussion on Sunday at 9:30 in the parking lot as we watch the transformation of the palms. And please plan to join us in the sanctuary on Wednesday, March 5th at noon to receive your ashes.

The February stated session meeting for First Presbyterian Church was held in the session room on Monday, February 24, 2025 at 4:00 p.m.

Moderator Bea Miller opened the meeting with prayers for everyone's concerns.

All Elders were present: Billy Kirby, Monica Stevens, Anne Madonia, Ron Rebman, Nancy Moore, Johnny Pinkard, Susan Pilson, Judy King, & Janet Fentress

Guests: Joan Montgomery and Cindy Franck of "Weekday School Task Force Committee" (WSTF) gave a report on the status

of our Weekday School, following six weeks of meetings with their committee.

WSTF committee- recommended changes to the Manuel of Operations(M.O.O.)based on societal changes following the Covid pandemic with a time line to implement these changes. Also, to give the Task Force approval to continue to go forward and look for a new Director, who will be charged with promoting our preschool within the community, with a fresh new perspective.

The Session unanimously approved – MSP

Devotion- Nancy Moore gave the devotional based on Isaiah 58- "repairing the Breech" as relates to the upcoming "One Great Hour of Sharing"

Moderator's Report- Bea requested verification of her employment, as related to Doug's former medical coverage. Liz Ferrell (Clerk) and Henry Moore (Treasurer) signed documents on behalf of the church- MSP

Reviewed request from Beth Chapman to have her late husband, Bob Chapman's, (former FPC Director of Music), ashes be inurned in our columbarium, with a private family service, with ministers Reverend Keith Ritchey, former First United Methodist and Jon Martins, former Associate Pastor FPC -Martinsville to officiate,followed by a family luncheon in the Fellowship Corridor for family -MSP

Request from Kim Weiderholt, Moderator of the Presbytery Cabinet, for FPC to host an in person Presbytery

meeting on Saturday, June 28th to celebrate Carl Utley, General Presbyter's, last Presbytery meeting and retirement -MSP

Bea advised she would be out of office 4/7/25- 4/12/25 on vacation and needssomeone to "man" the pastoral cell phone.

Clerks Report-

Read letter from Beth Chapman requesting inurnment of Bob's ashes in our columbarium, two outside ministers for the service and luncheon following service in the Fellowship Corridor. -MSP

Voted to approve Janet Fentress's Building Use Form for Chapman family luncheon following service- MSP

Read letter from Romar Elevator acknowledging FPC's letter to cancel our service contract.

Shared letter from member, Jane Townsend, thanking "Cooks Who Care" for the delicious meal in January.

Approved the following dates for 2025 Session Meetings: (The 4th Monday of the month, unless that date falls on a holiday) 3/24, 4/28,5/19, 6/23, no meeting in July, 8/25, 9/22,10/27 & 12/1 - MSP

Worship Committee- recommended the following:

"Palm Sunday in the Park" 9 a.m. service with other local churches on April 13with an inclement weather plan to move service into our sanctuary - MSP

Communion served on (Maunday)Thursday, April17 by Intinction - MSP

Communion served (trays) on Easter Sunday, April 20- MSP

Worship Information- FPC will host the March 5, Ash Wednesday service at noon,followed by a light lunch- Forest Hills and First Collinsville will be participating

On April 3, FPC will host an Ecumenical Lenten lunch for local area participating churches.

Administration- reported we have received 45 pledges at \$198,740 for 2025

Passed out and reviewed the proposed 2025 Annual Budget with Session. The budget was approved. - MSP

Endowment is up \$51,000. from our last report in December.

We will likely need to take approximately \$257,105* from endowment in 2025

*This amount does NOT include expenses for roof, elevator, HVAC or mold abatement.

Christian Education- Our Adult Sunday school class just completed the book "Half Truths" and will begin a Lenten study devotional on "Grief".

Congregational Care- Susan shared a list of dates for upcoming congregational lunches, Palm Sunday Brunch, Maunday Thursday covered dish supper and "Lemonade on the Lawn"- MSP

Also, reported the next "Cooks Who Care" meal cooking session will be Tues., March 11.

Facilities- Johnny reported the work on our slate roof has been completed with 400 slates replaced by The Durable Slate Company, who also cleaned the gutters along the slate roof.

The elevator has been repaired. We have a contract with American Elevator in Reidsville with quarterly inspections.

Mission- Ron reported at least 80 volunteers from our church, our 3 "sister" churches and friends, have signed up for Sat., March 1 for our 2nd "Rise Against Hunger" meal packing event, with a goal of 14,000 meal bags.

Think Tank- Anne reported a committee meeting with Andrew Palmer, V-P of Leasing for Lester Properties is planned for Thursday, March 6 @ 1:30 p.m. to discuss leasing and potential opportunities for our Education Wing.

Bea closed with our meeting with prayer at 6:20 p.m.

Our next Session Meeting will be held on Monday, March 31, 2025 @ 4:00 p.m.with Anne Madonia providing the devotion.

A makeup Presbytery meeting (for the snowed out February meeting in Blacksburg) will be held at Quaker Memorial Presbyterian Church in Lynchburgfrom 9 a.m.-3p.m. on Thursday, March 6, 2025.
