Pastor's Corner

Dear First Presbyterian family,

The Thomas Merton prayer, which I have referenced in a few sermons, has guided me through uncertainty and struggle – through thresholds. A threshold is the time between what has been and what will be. We are standing together in the threshold of the church we have known, and the church God is calling us to become. It is an unsettling yet hope filled time. Change is unsettling. Change often requires the release of familiar expectations, as we embrace new ways of being. With so much in flux, thresholds are places of prayer and discernment.

The Thomas Merton prayer acknowledges that we do not know the future, but God does. And God will lead us to God's future for our church: "My Lord God, I have no idea where I am going. I do not see the road ahead of me. I cannot know for certain where it will end. Nor do I really know myself, and the fact that I think that I am following your will does not mean that I am actually doing so. But I believe that the desire to please you does in fact please you. And I hope I have that desire in all that I am doing. I hope that I will never do anything apart from that desire. And I know that if I do this you will lead me by the right road, though I may know nothing about it. Therefore will I trust you always, though I may seem to be lost and in the shadow of death. I will not fear, for you are ever with me, and you will never leave me to face my perils alone."

This is a good prayer for our Lenten journey, which begins on Wednesday, February 22 at noon with our Ash Wednesday service followed by lunch. Please join us.


