Pastor's Corner

Dear First Presbyterian family,

When there is a difference between where we want to be and where we are, we say that there is a Gap. Closing the Gap becomes one of our most important challenges. Our Gap lies between our concerns and our aspirations. Our concern is that we, as a faith community, cannot continue with the status quo that served us well in the past. We must adapt to a different world, community, way of using our building, and way of being the church. Our aspiration is to radiate love within our congregation and out into our local neighborhood and even further out into Martinsville.

Changing how we operate is hard; it makes us feel uncomfortable. Most of us would rather keep doing what we are doing. We are grateful for who we have been and we are comfortable with that identity. However, we know that we now need to look forward more than we look backward if we are going to grow into who God is calling us to be. Right now, our aspirations are not yet well defined. We don't have a concrete picture of what closing the Gap will look and feel like and it's difficult and uncomfortable to live in uncertainty.

The important thing to remember is that when we look honestly at the Gap with a clear purpose to guide us, we will generate new energy and excitement for what is ahead of us. We will know that radiating love takes all of us working together for a common purpose—a purpose that will take us out of our comfort zone as we achieve our greatest aspirations. We have started our discernment process by exploring change through the Adaptive Change workshops and the follow-up Purpose Labs.

The next exciting step in this process is to create a Think Tank—a working group drawn from volunteers in the congregation. The Think Tank will examine who we are now and who we feel God is calling us to be and then identify the adaptive and technical challenges we will face as we seek God's new future for us. As the Think Tank workshops our challenges, their outcomes will be presented to the Session, where the decisions for our way forward will be made. Please prayerfully consider joining the Think Tank. When everyone is part of the process, amazing things happen. Tough problems become simpler. Big aspirations become reachable. While I realize that a Think Tank including all of us, would be overwhelming; it is important to have many, varied voices in this process so that all aspects of our church and life together are considered. If you are interested in joining the Think Tank, please let me know.
