Pastor's Corner

Dear First Presbyterian family,

Ash Wednesday was a blessing! Thank you to all who came, worshipped, helped with lunch, ate, and enjoyed everyone's company! We used our kintsugi bowl for the ashes. It was touching to have the sign of the ashes come from the beautiful brokenness of our kintsugi bowl. These powerful symbols remind us that it is God who brings life to both ash and brokenness. Also, during our service we introduced a Taize hymn. The Taize community is an ecumenical Christian monastic fraternity that has become one of the world's most important sites of Christian pilgrimage. Over 100,000 young people from around the world make pilgrimage to Taize each year for prayer, Bible study, sharing and communal work. The music of Taize emphasizes simple phrases, repeated and sometimes sung in canon. During the Ash Wednesday service we sang, *O Lord Hear My Prayer*, which is found in our Glory to God hymnal #471.

As our Lenten journey begins, please mark your calendar for our Maundy Thursday communion service with the stripping of the church and Tenebrae on Thursday, April 6. Dinner will be served at 6:00, with worship at 7:00. I will need volunteers to help with the stripping of the church and the Tenebrae. Please let me know if you are interested.

As we observe Lent with self-examination and penitence, prayer and fasting, works of love, and meditation on God's word, may the word's of the Taize him stay with us on our journey: O Lord, hear my prayer. O Lord, hear my prayer. When I call, answer me. O Lord, hear my prayer. O Lord, hear my prayer. Come and listen to me.



Another successful breakfast last Saturday! The kitchen was bustling and the




fellowship hall was full! In total, we served over 100 people; 50+ dined in, while over 60 were to go meals.
