Psalm 146

It seems that from the time I wake up until the time I go to sleep, I am surrounded by a variety of voices from the internet, the radio, television, movies, periodicals, books, and conversations with real people. These voices try tell me what to think, who and what to like or dislike, what to do and how to do it. Many of these voices have conflicting messages, but the one thing they allhave in common is that they believe they are solely and absolutely correct in their views and plans for what I should do. It is exhausting sorting through so many messages to find the truth.

Psalm 146 praises God and teaches us that we are happiest when we look to God for our help and hope. In the list of the things that God has done and continues to do for us, the things that are important to God, we are given a model for living. Starting at verse 5 we read:

"Happy are those whose help is the God of Jacob,
Whose hope is in the Lord their God,
Who made heaven and earth, the sea and all that is in them,
Who keeps faith forever;
Who executes justice for the oppressed;
Who gives food to the hungry.

The Lord sets the prisoners free;
The Lord opens the eyes of the blind.
The Lord lifts up those who are bowed down;
The Lord loves the righteous.
The Lord watches over strangers;
He upholds the orphan and the widow...

We are not God, and we cannot do what God can do, but we can value and care for creation, and we can nurture the creative spark in ourselves and others. We can live our lives being as faithful as we can to God's righteousness by caring for those who are victims of injustice and oppression, those who are in need of food, shelter, healthcare, and a safe community. Our work oftenincludes providing direct care for the needs of people we know. Also, living within God's righteousness can include working to change systems, policies, and practices that create and perpetuate the oppression of exclusion, poverty, substandard living conditions, hunger, and a life with no hope. It is God's nature to show us and not just tell us the right way to live. When the voices of the world clamor for our attention and obedience, look to emulate the way God cares for us and our path will become clearer and the false and empty voices will fade into insignificance.

Loving Father, in times of uncertainty and confusion, help us look to you and the way you care for all of us, so that we will know how to live and how to share your love with others. Silence those voices that lead us away from honoring you, and strengthen our will to follow your example. In Jesus' name we pray. Amen.
