Pastor's Corner

Dear First Presbyterian family,

Remember Kintsugi? We have been given a beautiful Kintsugi bowl to add to our worship space, helping us remember, "the art of Kintsugi is when broken pottery is repaired with gold, silver or brass filling seams. This metaphor represents us when we are broken...we can heal and become stronger, wiser and more beautiful when we mend. We have a more valuable life with knowledge gained from experience. We become better than before."

On Sunday, we talked about all our gratitude for the life we have had together – a life we loved, a life that formed us. Our gratitude is in every broken piece of our Kintsugi bowl. Gratitude is the foundation, the building pieces, for our future together. Our Gratitude is held together by God's golden light that forms us into a new vessel of love. This new beautiful, stronger, wiser bowl is our purpose in this precious time and place that God has given us to be God's light.

This past Monday thirteen of us attended the first Purpose Lab, hosted by Rev. Jen Brothers, Church Leadership Ministry Specialist at Presbytery of the Peaks. Here is some of what our group found meaningful:

We opened with the following, disruptive prayer:

Lord, make me a channel of disturbance

Where there is apathy, let me provoke

Where there is compliance, let me bring questions

Where there is silence, may I be a voice

Where there is too much comfort and too little action, grant disruption Where there are doors closed and hearts locked, grant the willingness

to listen

When laws dictate and pain is overlooked, grant that I may rather seek to do justice than to talk about it

To be with as well as for the poor

To love the unlovable as well as the lovely

Lord make me a channel of disturbance

Amen.

We talked about our natural instinct toward self-protection that drives us to preserve the status quo of our life at church. This primal instincts becomes a barrier and gets in our way of following Jesus out onto the water, or into the boat, or on the road to Jerusalem.

We looked at a boat with a leak, and discussed the various ways the people in the boat chose to deal with the leak:



And one participant added:

One of the things that struck me and stayed with me was the quotation that said emergency and emerge come from the same root and that new things can come forth when we are dealing with perceived emergencies. Those in the early church did not have preconceived notions about what a church was—they just worked to live into Christ's gospel with the help of the Holy Spirit. Perhaps in discerning our purpose, we need to set aside everything our culture has taught us about what a church is supposed to be and do and simply ask what Christ is calling us to do with the resources and tools we have (including our members, our wealth, and our building). God is not finished with FPC, and we need to align ourselves with God's purpose for our continued presence and ministry in Martinsville (and possibly beyond).

As we continue the process of discerning our purpose, we are seeking a purpose that: energizes, produces joy or a deep sense of meaning, provides clarity for our walk together, engages our hearts, builds resilience, feeds us spiritually, emotionally and physically while providing something we can grow toward.

God is in the process, guiding our way forward. Please join us in praying for discernment.
