## Who can we trust? Psalm 40: 1-5

"I waited patiently for the Lord; he inclined to me and heard my cry. He drew me up out of the desolate pit, out of the miry bog, and set my feet on a rock, making my steps secure. He put a new song in my mouth, a song of praise to our God. Many will see and fear, and put their trust in the Lord. Happy are those who make the Lord their trust, who do not turn to the proud, to those who go astray after false gods. You have multiplied, O Lord my God, your wondrous deeds and your thoughts toward us; none can compare with you. Were I to proclaim and tell of them, they would be more than can be counted." (NRSV)

I was drawn to Psalm 40 this week as I pondered the continuing cascade of calamities in the world. I have to admit that there are times when stresses of a personal nature and/or of a more global nature seem to pile up and become almost unbearable. What is a person to do? Today's psalmist took his problems to God. He cried out to God and God answered.

We sometimes have the mistaken idea that we need to use correct, well-planned words when we pray, but that just isn't the case. God wants to commune with us through simple, honest, heart-felt prayer. If what we are thinking and feeling is a jumbled mess, then take it to God and let it all spill out in in jumbled mess. Anger, confusion, fear, depression—give it all to God. While our God is the mighty Creator, our God is also the God of infinite love and compassion. God will embrace us and our difficulties and surround us with steadfast love. To paraphrase the words of the psalmist, God can draw us up from whatever desolate pit or miry bog we seems to be sliding into and set us on the firm rock of God's infinite love and care.

Not only will God strengthen us and set our feet on the right path when we are weighed down by daily problems, God wants to fill us with the joy of God's presence so that we are able to live our life as a song of praise to God. As the goodness God wills for us suffuses our lives, others will see and take notice, wanting that same joy for themselves. We will be beacons to draw others to God.

The world promises us all sorts of things—wealth, fame, power, status, material possessions, and there is nothing wrong with any one of those things unless we put our trust and reliance on them and begin to derive our identity and sense of purpose from them. Then they become idols. As the psalm says, "Happy are those who make the Lord their trust." Money, power, status, fame, and material possessions can all disappear in the blink of an eye, but the faithful love of God remains forever. God's goodness, mercy, and love are multiplied and made available to us daily. Our God is trustworthy and sure in times of calm and peace and in times of trouble and we are invited to trust all of our joys and concerns to God's loving care. With the psalmist let us say, "May all who seek you rejoice and be glad in you; may those who love your salvation say continually, 'Great is the Lord!'" (v 16).

Loving Lord, sometimes it is difficult for us to trust anyone—even you. Remind us of your loving care for us and your desire to share our burdens and our joys. Teach us to trust you and serve you to the glory of your holy name through your Son, Jesus Christ. Alleluia! Amen.
