Pastor's Corner Elder, Monica Stevens

" The Lord says (vs.16)...Don't remember the prior things; don't ponder ancient history. Look! I am doing a new thing; now it sprouts up; don't you recognize it? I'm making a way in the desert, paths in the wilderness." Isaiah 43:18-19 CEB

When Isaiah first delivered those words, Israel was in exile and had been in exile for roughly seventy years. Since most of the people he addressed had been born in captivity, life in Babylon was all they knew, and they could only dream of the life their people had lived in Judea. Now God was preparing them to return to and rebuild Jerusalem. At the beginning of Chapter 43, God, speaking through his prophet, reminded Israel that God loves them. He said, "Don't fear, for I have redeemed you; I have called you by name; you are mine. When you pass through the waters, I will be with you; when through the rivers, they won't sweep over you. When you walk through the fire, you won't be scorched and flame won't burn you," (Isa. 43:1a-2). In verses 14 -17 God reminded Israel that God was the one who defeated the Babylonians just as God had defeated the Egyptians to free Israel from their bondage.

Then God tells Israel not to dwell on past events because God is doing something new. This new thing is sprouting up all around them, and when it seems that they can't go forward, God will make a way in the barren places and create a path in the wilderness for them to travel on toward their goal. The further we read into the Scriptures, we see over and over again that God is always creating, always doing new things.

God is using Isaiah's words to speak to us at First Presbyterian Church here in Martinsville. Our congregation has enjoyed a long and valuable ministry in the name of Jesus Christ in this community. This is something to be celebrated, but just as God cautioned Israel, we can't get stuck dwelling in the past. God is calling us to do a new thing and it is our job to discern what God is calling us to do so that we can remain a viable and vital witness to Jesus in this place.

As a part of our discernment process, sixteen people have volunteered to be part of a Think Tank that will learn to think outside of the boxes that have served us well in the past thus freeing ourselves to envision the new things that God might be calling us to do in the future. This process takes faith, trust, imagination, and patience. The Think Tank will engage in prayerful brainstorming, research, and discussion. In true Presbyterian fashion, all items they recommend for possible action will then be sent to the Session for consideration. As always, the Session has the final decision on any proposals.

The Think Tank has already met once and will meet again on April 3 at 2pm in the Session Room. It is crucial that all of us participate in this process in one way or another. If you cannot be part of the Think Tank, you can support their work in your prayers and you can enter into discussions with Think Tank members to hear what they are doing and give them your input on the issues they will discuss. To use

Paul's metaphor, we are called to be the Body of Christ, and as such, each one of us has a vital function to fulfill to maintain the health, vigor, and purpose of the Body. Thanks be to God who calls us together to work as one. Amen.
