From the Bridge Pastor Jenny Spivey

"When are we going to be there?" the little voice from the backseat inquired. Clint and I sighed, since we were only just north of Roanoke, with nearly seven hours to go until we would arrive at Nana's house in Delaware. At each repeat of the question, we would give a number of hours, or even try to explain and name the number of states we would travel through on the way. ("We're STILL in Virginia?!" was the incredulous declaration.) There wasn't any answer we could give that seemed to satisfy her. Finally, we urged her to just rest for a while; we'll get there, we told her

Along our journey as a congregation, some ask, "when are we going to be there?" The "there" may be the arrival of a new pastor, or an end to the period of transition, or a renewed sense of purpose and ministry. The destination seems distant, and the journey long. (The PNC is STILL reading PIFs?! we may ask incredulously.) Perhaps we can come to realize that there aren't any easy answers to satisfy the questions (the pastor will be here in 7 months and 13 days...), nor any quick shortcuts to shorten the journey.

Our family faith story can be a resource for us in our journey. The experience of the people Israel – the story their bondage in Egypt, their deliverance to freedom, their wandering in the wilderness – echoes our experience. Just as God delivered the people Israel into freedom and led them to the promised land, so God is working to deliver us through this transition into a new and hopeful chapter in our common life. Over the next several weeks, the sermons will explore this narrative from Exodus and Deuteronomy. I invite you to engage this story again: in the Word read and proclaimed, in prayer and song, in the presence of God and one another in worship.

Sunday, Nov. 11 – *Consecration and Stewardship Sunday*, *Don't Forget to Call*, Deuteronomy 26; As the people near the promised land, Moses instructs them to remember and give thanks for God's providing.

<u>Stewardship Committee</u> WHITE BEAN CHICKEN CHILI

Recipe given to Lang Mauck by Harriet Regen

2 TBS Vegetable Oil

4 cooked chicken breasts (chopped)

1 onion, chopped

2 cloves garlic, minced

1 can (14.5 oz) chicken broth

1 can (18.75 oz) tomatillos, drained & chopped

1 can (16 oz.) diced tomatoes

1 can (7 oz.) diced green chilies

1/2 tsp dried oregano

1/2 tsp ground coriander seed

1/4 tsp. ground cumin

1 can (15 oz) white beans

2 ears fresh corn

Salt/pepper to taste

DIRECTIONS

- 1. Heat oil and cook onion and garlic until soft
- 2. Stir in broth, tomatillos, tomatoes, chilies, and spices. Bring to boil and simmer for 20 minutes. (Use second can diced tomatoes if can't find tomatillos)
