Minute for Mission What First Presbyterian Church Has Meant to My Life By: Sandra Ford

Writing thoughts on what this church has meant to me was a welcome opportunity, for it brought back a stream of memories dating back to 1959. We had just come to Martinsville, my husband's hometown, and I was planning to move my membership to Anderson Memorial Presbyterian Church, as we were then called.

The church's move from its old location on Church Street had taken place a few months before, and folks still talked about walking from the old church, carrying Bibles and hymnbooks to the new church, singing Onward Christian Soldiers as they walked. It was an exciting time. The sanctuary had not been completed so we worshiped in the Fellowship Hall, which was filled each Sunday.

Soon, I had my first visitor from the church, Carolyn Franck, who came to welcome me into the church and tell me of the church's various programs. As she spoke, she scooped up our six-month old baby onto her lap and asked me the question that was to become a turning point in my life; "Sandra, what do you plan to do for the church?" I was startled, for I most likely was thinking about what the church would be doing for me and my family. Unaffected, she continued. "We need a children's choir director." I answered that I had never done anything like that and doubted my ability to help in that way. Undeterred, she continued. "I understand that you play piano." I said that my skills were rusty, but she was not discouraged. "You have taught school." I agreed. "I think you would do fine," she countered, and with her encouragement I began a very fulfilling experience, and one that would later generate a career change in midlife.

Within the fellowship of this church community my family made deep and lasting friendships. Here we were comforted in times of loss, prayed for in periods of serious illness and uplifted on occasions of joy. It was in this church that we were given the opportunities to work as volunteers in programs within the congregation and the broader community. These years have been a wonderful journey and I look back gratefully to those whose lives touched and enriched mine, and who continue to help me grow in the love of Jesus Christ.
