Devotional Meditation Elder Monica Stevens October 13, 2021

Praying Psalm 46

God is our refuge and strength, a very present help in time of trouble.

Father, sometimes a refuge is exactly what I need. Trouble seems to surround me and my strength is gone. I feel overcome by sadness, grief, fear and uncertainty. Let me shelter in your love.

Therefore we will not fear, though the earth should change, though the mountains shake in the heart of the sea; though the waters roar and foam, though the mountains tremble with its tumult.

Creation reacts to the stresses in our environment as fires rage, earthquakes convulse, storms pummel, winds howl, and waters rise. Fear and helplessness seek to overwhelm me, but in the refuge of your holy presence I am comforted. You strengthen me and give me hope to do what I can to heal the earth and your people.

There is a river whose streams make glad the city of God, the holy habitation of the Most High. God is in the midst of the city; it shall not be moved. God will help it when the morning dawns.

Lord, just as water replenishes the earth, your life-giving presence flows through me, reviving my soul and my spirit. You fill me to the brim. You are with me when I rise and you surround me like a blanket when I sleep. You are always with me and you will never leave me.

The nations are in an uproar, the kingdoms totter; he utters his voice, the earth melts. The Lord of hosts is with us; the God of Jacob is our refuge.

Abba, so often it seems that the affairs of human beings are a dangerous, confused mess. It seems that people have wandered so far from your path that greed, ambition, selfishness, and power are more important than your values of love,

kindness, justice, mercy, and forgiveness. Teach me to remember that with one word you could cause all of our self-serving golden calves to melt into nothingness. Let me forsake everything that does not honor you so that I may cling to your steadfast love and find my refuge in you.

Come, behold the works of the Lord; see what desolations he has wrought on the earth. He makes wars to cease to the end of the earth; he breaks the bow, and shatters the spear; he burns the shields with fire.

Lord, so often life seems fragile and fleeting. Remind me that in all things you are the source of life now and eternally. There is nothing and no one that can separate us from your love. When things in my life fall apart and crumble, you replace those things with your goodness, righteousness, and mercy. You protect, shield, and defend me as I struggle to live the life you desire for me.

"Be still, and know that I am God! I am exalted among the nations, I am exalted in the earth."

Father, teach me to trust all of my doubts, fears, grief, and anxieties to your care. You are the one true God, Creator of everything that exists. No one and nothing is like you, yet you have created me to be your beloved child not due to any merit of my own, but simply because you love me. This stops me in my tracks. There is nothing I can do but kneel in your presence and let your love wash over me.

The Lord of hosts is with us; the God of Jacob is our refuge.

Lord, you are as you ever have been and ever will be. Draw me close to you, surround me with your love, and let me find my refuge in you. Amen.

From the Transition Team

When Pastor Mark retired on August 31, our church began the process of finding a new pastor. A Transition Team, made up of Monica Stevens, Denny Casey, and Joan Montgomery was appointed by the Session's Administration Committee. In an effort to keep the congregation informed we want to tell you the work that has been done and the work to be done.

- The Transition Team met with Carl Utley, our General Presbyter, on 9/16/21 for training.
- Responsibilities of the Transition Team are:
- 1. Identify and recommend to Session a candidate for Interim Pastor;
- 2. Identify Transitional Priorities for Interim start up;
- 3. Consult staff and elders about needs from Interim Pastor;

- 4. Complete the Presbytery's Ministry Information Form (MIF) and seek appropriate approvals. The MIF describes our church in location, membership, mission statement, narrative questions, and top 10 Leadership Competencies, salary range, and basically what we are looking for in an Interim Pastor;
- 5. Work with the Interim during transition as requested by Interim; and
- 6. Communicate to congregation about transitional process.
- We were charged with interviewing staff and session members for what they wanted professionally and personally in an Interim Pastor. That has been completed.
- The Transition team met on 9/28/21 to consolidate the interview responses and to begin completing the MIF.
- The goal is to present the MIF to Session at the October meeting for approval.
- Upon approval by the Session, the Committee on Ministry, and the Presbytery, the MIF will be submitted to the Presbytery.
- Candidates will be identified based on matching our needs with candidate applications and the Transition Team can then begin interviewing.
- The goal is to find an Interim by the end of 2021.
