## **Pastor's Corner**

Dear First Presbyterian family,

Much to my chagrin, it feels like most of the intersections in Franklin County are becoming roundabouts or traffic circles. As I engage the traffic circles, I realize that few among us really know how to navigate these new constructions. Transitional ministry, our current phase of ministry, is like a traffic circle. We know the road. We are familiar with all the traffic signs. But for some reason when the road and signs are configured in a traffic circle, few of us are comfortable. Navigating traffic circles feels foreign. This is the nature of transitional ministry. We know the church and people, but the process can feel uncomfortable.

In addition to being in transition we are, hopefully, coming out of a pandemic. The changes thrust upon us during our response to COVID, have forever changed our world and the ways we interact with each other. Life will never be *the way it was*. And church will never be *the way it was*. Many things are still familiar, like people and place, but we now gather in new unfamiliar online ways. Habits and expectations have also changed.

Change is a constant throughout our personal and communal lives, yet often our response to change is resistance. The founders of adaptive leadership theory suggest that we humans don't actually fear change--we fear loss. When our sense of loss is greater than our sense of purpose, resistance kicks in. But God is always doing a new thing, always calling us into growth, change, transition and transformation.

On **October 18 and 19** we (First Presbyterian Martinsville) are hosting a Presbytery sponsored workshop called **Adaptive Change**. This two-day workshop for Teaching Elders, Ruling Elders, staff, and other lay leaders is built on an adaptive leadership framework designed to help us thrive through the challenges of our time.

I am cordially inviting you, all of you, to attend the Adaptive Change workshop on

**October 18 and 19** in our session room. These two-days will give us the tools we need to grow into our mission and purpose as God's church on Patrick Henry

# **Church Organ Update from Spencer**

Dear Church Family,

As many of you are now aware, First Presbyterian's Pipe Organ is in a bit of disrepair. When I joined the church in February, I had a goal to tune, clean, and repair the pipes. These pipes are hidden behind the wood screen to the left of the sanctuary. Alongside an organ builder, and friend, we adjusted and continue to work with the pipes to ensure the best working conditions.

However, the pipes are not the only thing that require maintenance. The organ console, the one I play from, works off of electronics and computers. The current system is over 18 years old and no longer functions as of August. While I "hot-wired" the system into giving me some control our pipe organ could malfunction any time.

Now you may be wondering, is the church repairing the organ, what's happening with everything? And the simple answer is, YES!

The long-and-short version is that the Session approved my request to update the "inner" workings of the organ. An analogy that may shed light on the problem is as follows: Think of the Pipe Organ like a car. The work completed earlier this year was a basic oil change and tire rotation. Tuning and cleaning the pipes helps provide quality sound. However, now the transmission is out. To have a functioning car (in this case pipe organ) we must replace the transmission.

Orders are placed and the builder and I are awaiting the parts to ship. Due to current supply chains and state-of-the-world shipping, installation, and proper adjustments will take time. It is with my greatest hope that our pipe organ is fully operational by Christmas!

Do not despair as I assure you, our congregation, friends, and family, that the music program will continue! We are all excited to share the joys of the holidays season through song. Feel free to reach out to me if you have questions or concerns. I am here for you all. I will continue to update you all as things occur.
