From the Bridge Pastor Jenny Spivey

From the Session

Since the departure of Interim Pastor Joe Reggin, many folks have noticed the term "Bridge Pastor" to refer to my function and role in the congregation. So, what's a Bridge Pastor? That's a great question. If you go looking in the Book of Order, you won't find it, it's not there. Officially speaking, I continue to be your Associate Pastor, the position to which I was called and installed just over three years ago. But with the departure of the Interim Pastor, the Presbytery of the Peaks has appointed me to moderate the Session, and serve as acting head of staff until a Solo Pastor is called and installed.

We continue to be in an "interim period." The interim period is an in-between period, generally the time between the departure of one installed pastor and the arrival of the next. But for our congregation, this interim time will mark a larger transition: an in-between period that involves the transition from having a Pastor and Associate Pastor, to being a Solo Pastor church. This decision was made by the Session earlier this year, through a process of discernment involving pastoral functions and redundancy, budget and stewardship considerations, and ministry and mission direction for the future.

One of my favorite Old Testament scholars Terrance Fretheim observed, "metaphors matter." He observed how, in relation to God, language, images and metaphors shaped belief. I believe the same is true for us in this period. We are not simply in-between, but moving into a new model for ministry. Part of my role as Bridge Pastor is to metaphorically "build a bridge" from the twopastor model to a Solo Pastor model. To employ the title (and metaphor) Bridge Pastor, we acknowledge a shift in my pastoral function and responsibilities. The metaphor of a bridge is a rich one, that implies a connection and link to the past, as well as a moving toward the future.

We are on a journey together in this bridge time that requires strength and courage. Our relationships with one another are strengthened as we worship, study and "play" together. As Pastor, I do a lot of worship and study, AND I love to play (and so do my girls). I invite you join me in worship, join me in Bible Study and Sunday School, and last but not least—join me to play. In addition to my office hours at church, I am going to invite you all to join me for lunch each Wednesday at Chick-Fil-A, about 12:30-1:30. Nothing formal, just to share time, share table, and, yes, play. At a special Session meeting on the afternoon of Sunday, August 25, the Session discussed and agreed upon the following description of pastoral functions and responsibilities, and accompanying estimation of allocation of hours for the Bridge Pastor. This is a tool to help structure the relationship between Pastor, Session and congregation. The expectation of the Pastor is to work 45-50 hours per week, with the following major areas of responsibility. This is shared with the recognition that these are approximations, and that there is some flexibility from week to week depending on the circumstances.

Bridge Pastor Functions and Responsibilities

Worship and Preaching 15 hrs per week (preparation, leading, delivery)

Teaching 5-10 hrs (preparation for and leading Sunday School, Bible Studies, other studies)

Administration 12-15 hrs Divided into two areas: Head of Staff function (staff meetings, coordination) Moderating Session, resourcing and equipping elders, lay leaders; committee meetings

Visitation 5-7 hrs (Home visits, hospital, counseling)

Presbytery commitments 5 hrs

Social/Community Functions 3-5 hrs

Personal Spiritual Practices 5 hrs (Study and reading, prayer, discernment, spiritual development)

The Session discussed and made note that "Youth Ministry" is not a major category, but that the Pastor's involvement with the youth ministry would be through teaching (leading occasional, but not all, youth programs and resourcing Youth Sundays), administration (resourcing through CE and equipping youth advisors) and visitation (ongoing relationship with youth and families).

From the Session

Response to People Seeking Financial Assistance

People from the Martinsville/Henry County area regularly call on the phone and come into the church building seeking financial assistance. Often these requests for assistance are made during office hours, and the Office Manager refers them to Grace Network. Occasionally, and a couple times very recently, people come to the building during other church functions seeking assistance. At times, they have entered even when doors should have been locked. In some situations, church members or other individuals have given small amounts of money to people. In situations where unknown people are in the church building, whether during normal hours or at other times, there is a concern for the safety of people in the building (staff, preschool, and members) and for the security of the facility.

FPC values responding to people in need in our community. One expression of that value is our participation in the ministry of Grace Network through planned financial support from our budget, through regular collections of items for their food pantry, and through the active participation of FPC members at Grace Network's facility. We choose to respond to, and feel we can best serve, people in need in our community through our cooperative efforts with Grace Network.

Our response to people who call on the phone, or come to our church building, shall include two points: 1) that we do not provide financial assistance directly to individuals, and 2) that we refer people to Grace Network as the agency which we support financially and through volunteers.

- •Pastoral Functions and Responsibilities for the Bridge Period were discussed and approved by consensus. These will be shared with the congregation.
- •The Session approved the creation of a new Session Committee, Outreach and Evangelism.

Liturgy as the Work of the People

Liturgy is the "form of worship as we gather as the people of God." It is the people's work. The authors refer to Sorne Kierkegaard"s The Purity of the Heart is to Will One Thing (New York; Harper Torchbook, 1956, p. 181), in which he claims many current congregations "have it backwords" when they think of the congregation as the audience, worship leaders as the actors and God an unseen prompter. Actually he says, "God is the audience...we (the members of the congregation) are the actors, and the worship leaders serve as the prompters." If we consider ourselves the audience, worship is "more like entertainment instead of our praise filled response to what God has done for us. Acting on the value of providing appropriate worship experiences for all members of the church family, and our commitment at the time of Baptism to nurture the children of our church, the Christian Education and Worship Committees have planned exciting programs for the younger members of our church family.
