Shifting Our Focus

Each of you should look not only to your own interests, but to the interests of others.

-Philippians 2:4

A famous psychologist, Dr. Karl Menninger, once gave a lecture on mental health and was asked during a question and answer segment, "What advice would you give to someone who felt a nervous breakdown coming on?" Without hesitation Dr. Menninger replied, "Lock up your house, go across the railroad tracks, find someone in need and find a way to help that person." The point of his answer was that when we become so focused

on our own problems and circumstances we can become withdrawn and inwardly frozen which may effectively remove us from active participation in the life that God has given us! This will prevent us from ever being what God intends for us to be, including serving others effectively. We can freeze in our own tracks!

Following Christ is not an exercise of protecting our own interests but rather a grateful response of our hearts for what God has already done for us. We respond by reaching out to others and lovingly serving them in God's holy name. When I look back on tough times in my own life,



times when I have felt sorry for myself for some reason or another, I've experienced release from my anxiety by changing my focus to others and getting myself involved in serving. Routine self examination is healthy. An obsession with self is not.

As we go through this season of Advent, leading into Christmas, be reminded that our gift from God in the Christ Child has already been given to us as believers and followers of Him. So today if we find ourselves frozen in our tracks by a difficult situation, shift focus from ourselves to Jesus and find someone to serve in His name! The weight will seem lighter and we can get moving once again.



Session Highlights for Stated Meeting November 24, 2014

• The Session voted to receive Carol Belcher and Gwen Seamon into membership of First Presbyterian Church.

- A financial report was received from the Church Treasurer. Eighty-two percent of pledges have been received.
- Milt Davis was elected as Treasurer for a one-year term.
- Joan Montgomery was elected as Clerk for a one-year term.
- A written report was received from Pastor Mark about his activities during the month
 of November and his gratitude to the congregation and Session for the support he
 has received. He also reported on youth activities.
- A draft of the 2015 budget was discussed and should be ready for a vote by the end of December.
- Each Session committee moderator reported on committee activities, events, and programs.
- The Session heard a report from those who attended a workshop in Salem about the Stephen Ministry. Stephen Ministry is the one-to-one lay caring ministry that takes place in congregations by individuals who are formally trained to provide high quality, confidential, Christ-centered care to people who are going through tough times. Seven persons attended the workshop. The Session has approved exploring this ministry for our congregation.
- A discussion was held on how to get King's Grant members who no longer drive to church services. Pastor Mark is discussing with the Facilities Director at King's Grant about volunteer drivers from our church to use their handicapped accessible van.
