Evelyn Clark graduates from the hospital

"On January 6, 2016, Evelyn suffered a traumatic fall while visiting friends in an unfamiliar apartment building, leaving her paralyzed from the waist down. Thanks to the amazing men and women in the Richmond Fire Department and EMS squad, she was lucky enough to survive but sustained a broken scapula, 12 broken ribs, 2 pelvic fractures, bilateral punctured lungs, 3 spinal fractures, and a severe spinal cord injury resulting in waist down paralysis. She spent two

critical weeks in the Surgical Trauma ICU at MCV, where she fought for her life every day as the expert staff helped to save her. After being stabilized, she was airlifted to the ICU at the Shepherd Center Hospital in Atlanta, Georgia, one of the best spinal cord injury rehab centers in the country. ..."

Evelyn's sister Elizabeth posted on May 27:

"First, for those who don't want to wade through the length of this update, Evelyn has moved to her outpatient room and her mailing address has changed!! Woohoo!

I have to start by apologizing again for the delay in the update, but MAN have we been busy! I finished up final exams last week and hopped in the car down to Atlanta. I can't tell you how impressed I was by the progress Evelyn has made. Last time I was with her she was using a Hoyer lift to get in and out of bed, a rolling shower chair, and was still in a lot of pain. I arrived late Friday evening and Evelyn was already in bed, but as soon as I arrived she said "Oh let me get up and chat!" to which I said "No no, don't go through all the trouble." But then she just grabbed her slideboard, sat herself up, and slid over to her chair. While this may not sound super impressive, it is such a huge accomplishment! It is hard to imagine, and even harder to describe, how difficult it is to just sit yourself up without the use of core ab muscles. The next few days I spent in constant amazement. She is getting a lot of sensation and muscle groups back in her abdomen and butt. This is really great news for mobility, but comes with growing pains. The fact that she can feel her bottom is extremely helpful for skin integrity and circulation; however, it also means that she gets very tired sitting all day. This led her to ask her physical therapist, Chris, to help her stand up. Chris took her over to the parallel bars and with some effort helped her to pull herself up to a standing position. She said she immediately felt a huge relief in her back and butt. But more importantly, she was standing! She could lock her knees on her own and hold her body weight up almost independently with her arms. Chris said this was very promising!

"Then, at the end of the week, we had her graduation ceremony from the hospital inpatient program. Her therapists organized a big gathering and everyone gave speeches. The previous mayor had chosen Evelyn to be the

"mayor" of the floor after he left, which was eventually changed to "princess" of the floor. There was a passing of the torch, where Evelyn then chose the next mayor to help patients who are having a hard time, showing the new admits around the floor, etc. Mom got a Superstar Caretaker award, and everyone said she was one of the best and hardest working caretakers they had ever seen, but we all knew that already. It was a very exciting day, but also very emotional. Ev has gotten very close to her therapy team and leaving them is not only sad, but very scary. Establishing the trust it takes to have someone support you the way a physical and occupational therapist does, both physically and emotionally, takes time.

"Then the next morning, we woke up and moved into the onsite apartments. The first thought we had was that it was so nice to sit around and talk without being disturbed. In the hospital room, there was someone knocking on the door and coming in almost every 20 minutes, no exaggeration. It was just a relief to have time to ourselves as a family, uninterrupted. There are definitely still some obstacles to overcome and some kinks to be worked out. ... All of the problems we are facing are because things are progressing and will be better in the long run, it just means we have to work harder for longer.


"I am heading to Richmond this week to pick up a Standing Frame for at home. Dad is working hard at home preparing the house for her return; building boxes for transfers and moving her bedroom downstairs. Thanks for bearing with me through this long update, there really is much more to share but I will save it for our next update."
