Jewish people celebrated Pentecost ("fiftieth
day"), a festival of first fruits which
marked the end of the Passover season. On
the first Day of Pentecost after Jesus' death,
resurrection and ascension, the Holy Spirit
came in a mighty way to the disciples who



were gathered in the upper room (Acts 2:1-21), appearing as tongues of fire above their heads. From that time on, they forgot all their fears and boldly proclaimed God's salvation through Jesus Christ. We remember this as the birthday of the church and will celebrate with **Birthday Cake** and Lemonade on the Lawn after the 11 o'clock service this Sunday. Be sure to wear RED to church!

Trip to Heifer Village in Maryland Monday-Friday, July 3-7

Youth (middle school and up) and adults are invited to participate in the adventure at Heifer Global Village at Shepherd's Spring, Sharpsburg, Maryland this summer.



The program is complete with international homes, gardens, and livestock that represent the living conditions for developing nations in which Heifer International works. This 5-day experience is open to all who would like to learn how to meet the challenges of global hunger. Forest Hills Presbyterian and Christ Episcopal churches are partnering with us to make the trip. The cost is

Pentecost Offering

The Pentecost Offering, one of four special offerings during the year, is focused on programs for children and young people. One of the recipients is the PC(USA) Young Adult Volunteer (YAV) program. YAVs are ages 19-30 years, who want to explore opportunities for service for one year. Please give generously this Sunday!



One YAV site is Boston, Massachusetts. Beverly Shank, a member of that church and friend of the Chaney family, writes about the program:

"It is officially called the Boston Food Justice YAV Program because all of the worksites are engaged in food security, access or sustainability. We are going into our fifth year in September and will welcome three more volunteers for an eleven-month term here. That will make seventeen alumni of the Boston program.



"Our model is a church partnering with a community non-profit that works in food justice. First United Presbyterian Church in Cambridge will host its second YAV this fall. He is a recent graduate of William and Mary College and is from the Richmond area. The church, the non-profit partner and the volunteer all contribute funds to the program support. Our YAV will be working with various meal programs in Cambridge shelters, the food rescue program in the city and certain food pantries. A goal of the program is encouraging

congregations to become involved in local food missions. Bennett may have mentioned cooking for Youth on Fire, the local homeless teen day program. Our first YAV, back in 2013-14 got us serving with this program.

"The YAVs themselves live in intentional community in a local apartment. They learn a great deal about local food sourcing and cooking and food justice work in Boston. Their chaplain guides their spiritual growth and vocational discernment. It is often a gap year after college that allows YAVs to think about careers, graduate school, etc.

"This opportunity to mentor young people and encourage young leaders in the church has been very rewarding for me. About half of the two dozen churches

in the Presbytery of Boston have some involvement with the program. The Board hopes to see it become a regular mission of the whole Presbytery."


Food Pantry Needs
